WHAT DID WE TEACH?

During our recent deconstruction project at <u>Ronald McDonald House Charities of Greater Cincinnati</u>, our team gained invaluable real-world experience operating within a fast-paced commercial jobsite. Working alongside <u>Jostin Construction</u> and other professional organizations, our trainees learned the importance of coordination, communication, and following project sequencing to ensure safety and efficiency. They navigated the unique logistics of working within an occupied nonprofit facility—adapting their approach to minimize disruption to guest families while still executing precise deconstruction work. The crew honed technical skills as well, using power and hand tools to carefully remove cabinetry, appliances, and fixtures for responsible reuse rather than landfill disposal. The project deepened their understanding of how mission-driven construction intersects with sustainability—reinforcing the professional standards expected on large-scale jobs.
