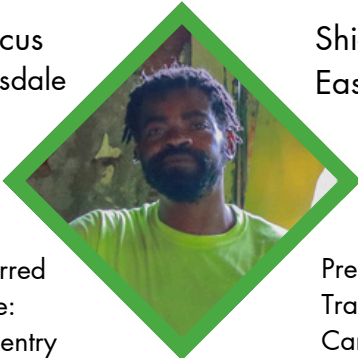

WHAT DID WE TEACH?

Building Value partnered with People Working Cooperatively on a selective deconstruction project at a property Cincinnati's Westwood neighborhood, giving our Construction Training Program participants hands-on experience across a wide range of interior demolition skills. Crews learned proper techniques for removing plaster from first and second floor walls, safely stripping wood flooring down to the subfloor, and disposing of kitchen cabinetry, baseboards, window and door casing, and a pinboard ceiling in the basement. Trainees also gained experience navigating attic-level deconstruction, removing plaster from dividing walls and clearing debris from tight spaces.

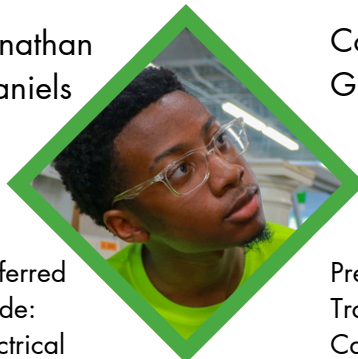
